#### Task description:

#### **Composition** (12 marks)

You are to compose a persuasive, discursive or imaginative text which explores a theme, idea or concept from *The Pedestrian* (by Ray Bradbury) or *The Funeral of the Unknown Soldier* (Paul Keating).

\*\* Your piece should be about 600 words

#### **Reflection** (8 marks)

Explain how your study of language and structural features in The Craft of Writing influenced the creative decisions you made in part (A). In your response make reference to at least ONE of your Module C prescribed texts. (10 marks)

\*\* Your reflection should be about 400 words

#### **Submission:**

To be submitted via the Google Classroom or via email. Your CRT must have access to editing rights on your google doc.
