You will be assessed on how well you:

- create a multimedia presentation and present this to the class
- undertake independent research to develop a commentary on the concept of Satire
- analyse texts referring to the purposes of Satire.

TASK:

Students are to create a multimedia presentation (your choice of digital format) and present it to the class, with a textual focus on the twin purposes of satire (to highlight and to educate).

In your response, write a detailed analysis of TWO texts (one must be literary) (length 500 words each analysis). Also include a copy of the text (date and place of publication) in your presentation and a brief biography of the composer (life details, overview of body of work – length 200 words).

Students are encouraged to complete and hand in a draft for teacher feedback. Drafts should be submitted no later than Thursday 27th July 2021 (via email if needed or in class – <u>shannon.johnston2@det.nsw.edu.au</u>). The teacher will mark only one draft per student.
