
NCCD 2025

Schools are required to participate in the annual Nationally Consistent Collection of Data on School Students with Disability (NCCD). The NCCD is a key data source in calculating the Low Level Adjustment for Disability equity loading. Principals are responsible for verifying the accuracy of this data.

Who to include


A student must be included in the NCCD when the following requirements are met:

- the student has a disability under the Disability Discrimination Act 1992 (Cth)
- the Disability Standards for Education 2005 have been met, including parent or carer consultation
- the student must have received disability adjustments for at least 10 weeks within the 12 months prior to the census date.
- the school has evidence of adjustments
- the school has provided information about the NCCD to the school community.

For shared enrolments, each school should include the student if they meet the above requirements.

Level of adjustment

The level of adjustment should be selected using the NCCD descriptors.



Notifying school communities: Schools must notify school communities about the NCCD. Schools can use a factsheet on the school website, newsletter, or send a letter to parents and carers.



Final data review and submit NCCD return

Schools must make changes in **both** ERN and the Online Data Collection website. For significant or complex changes to the data, request support from nccd@det.

Principals complete their final review of their school's data on the Online Data Collection website.

Principals must verify the accuracy and sign off their school's final NCCD return on the Online Data Collection website by 5pm, 15 August.
