

Dear Parent/s and Carer/s,

Our school is currently involved in research focused on improving the participation, belonging and wellbeing for every student at school. The interviews and focus groups took place earlier this year and the survey phase has now commenced. We would like to hear from your child or the young person you care for about what helps them to feel like they belong at school, what doesn't help, and what needs to change.

All students in Years 7-10 have been invited to take part in this online survey during class. The survey takes 10-15 minutes and the class teacher will be on hand to support the students at this time.

Participating in the survey is voluntary and your child or person you care for can choose to leave the survey at any time by closing the survey window. All answers will be anonymous, so no one will know whether your child did the survey or not or how they answered the questions. Their name and the name of our school will not be known or used in any reports from the research.

Findings from the survey will be made available to all schools in an easy-to-read summary and will also be published in a report and academic journals. The survey results will also inform professional learning for teachers. No individual will be identifiable in any information published. All data collected from the survey will be stored safely and securely at Southern Cross University for a minimum of 5 years.

The study has been approved by Southern Cross University Human Ethics Committee (approval number: **ECN 2021/146)** and the NSW Department of Education (approval number 2021/434). In the unlikely event any survey question makes your child feel uncomfortable, they are free to skip that question, take a break or opt out by closing the survey window.

All information is confidential and will be handled as soon as possible.

Students have also been advised they can choose to participate or not in the survey. You also have the option to decline the invitation (opt out) on behalf of your child by completing the attached 'opt out' form.
