Task description:

In this task you are to write two (2) extended responses to the question "To what extent have the legal and non-legal responses been effective in promoting and enforcing Human Rights." Specific details of the task are attached.

Submission:

Each response need be no longer than 750 words and must include full academic referencing and bibliography which comply with relevant academic conventions

Feedback (during and after task completion):

Written feedback and grade according to the attached marking rubric

NOTE: This is a compulsory assessment task. You are to make a genuine attempt at the task, and all protocols relating to plagiarism, collusion, and malpractice apply. You are required to submit on the above stated date. Failing to do so may result in the awarding of the grade of 0%. Task Outline

You are to prepare two extended responses responding to the question:

"To what extent have the legal and non-legal responses been effective in responding to violations of Human Rights."

One extended response must deal with an international example and one dealing with an Australian domestic example.

In addressing your selected topics you must address:

- A global overview of the human rights violations that have taken place
- The nature and extent of the violations in ONE specific country
- The international (and domestic) measures in place to deal with the issue
- An evaluation of the effectiveness of legal and non-legal responses to the issue
- Include LCMID, where appropriate, and provide copies of at least two examples for each essay.

Word limit for each extended response 750 words; 750 words per extended response.
