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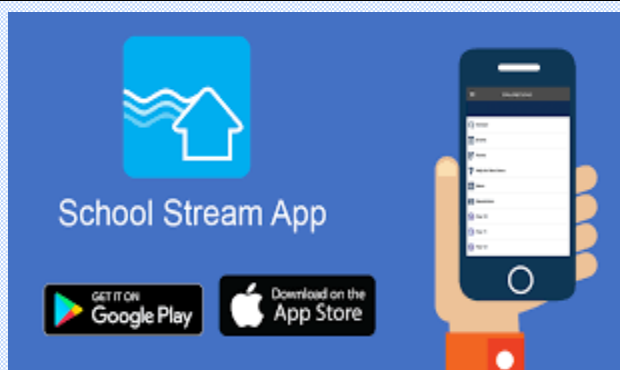

Da Vinci Competition Academic Decathlon



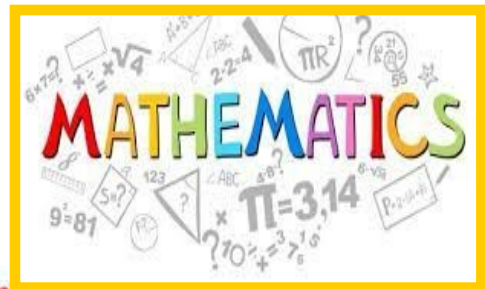

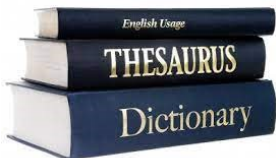

Our thanks also to Coonabarabran Rotary for their strong support of our school.

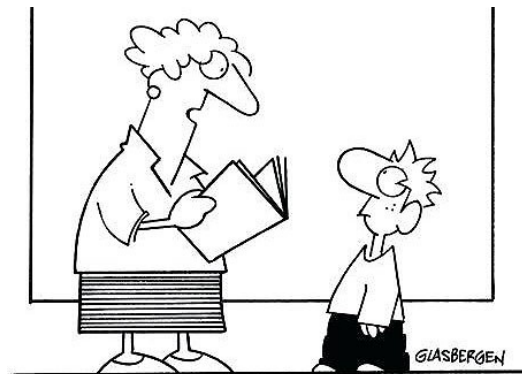

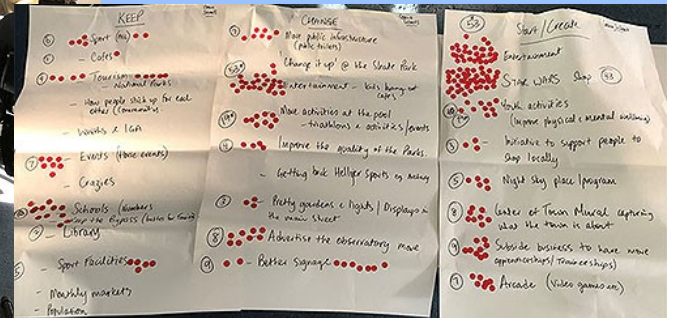
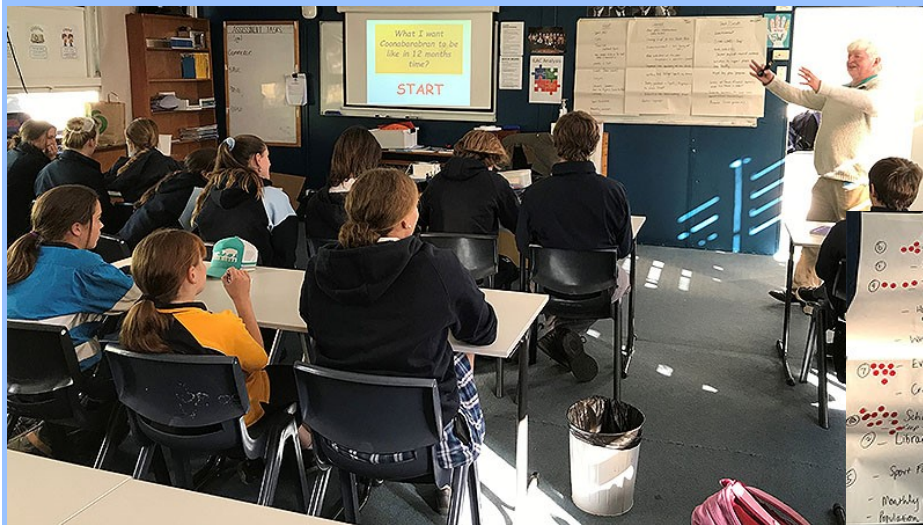

All is not lost however!

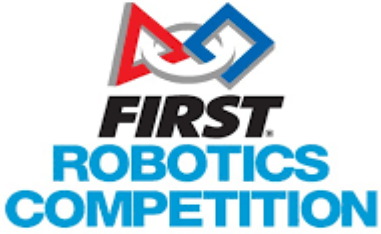
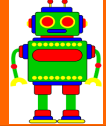
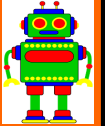
Some debates in the region are still ongoing, and Coonabarabran High School has a great chance at a regional final. We will keep you posted on the antics of this great bunch of debaters.

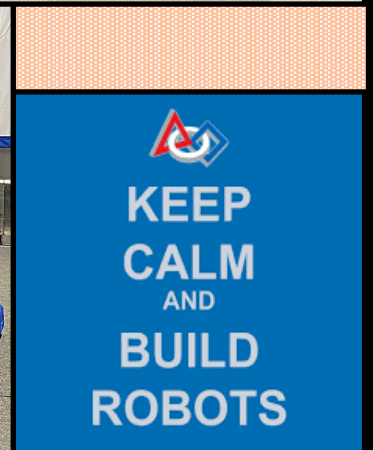
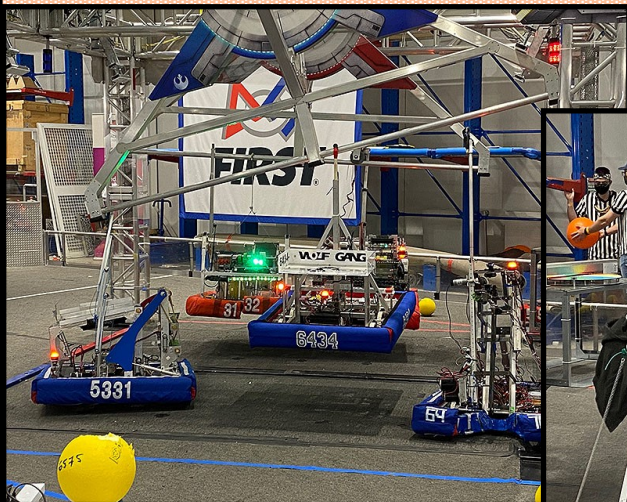
