

Dear Parent/Carer

As you know, strong school attendance is one of the best supports of a child's education. Accordingly this term our Home School Liaison Officer will be completing interviews with students about absences due to lateness.

This will be done via face to face at school or phone interview.

The law in New South Wales regarding attendance at school is very specific. Children between the ages of six and seventeen years must attend school on all days the school is open unless there are justified reasons for an absence.

- Arriving at school and class on time:
- Ensures that students do not miss out on important learning activities scheduled early in the day
- Helps students learn the importance of punctuality and routine
- Give students time to greet their friends before class
- Reduces classroom disruption

Lateness is recorded as a partial absence and must also be explained by parents.



School pupil achievements as noted in the school newsletter were discussed.
Reminder of the formal assemblies to be held in week 10 and the yr. 12 Formal will be held that week as well.
Reminder that Friday 30 August is a Pupil Free Day – the committee felt that a mid-term “break” is a better option that the first day of school and would like to see this continue.
The Aboriginal Medical Service (AMS) based in Dubbo approached the school wanting to work with students on their emotional wellbeing with a focus on resilience, violence and other mental health issues. 




