


Once a week on Tuesday, students head to the pool for two periods to participate in a range of activities including treading water, sculling, water familiarisation and using different kicking techniques. Flotation aids are used throughout the program to assist with gaining confidence, independence and skill.

The students find this program a valuable part of the curriculum. Through the water safety program students learn to communicate, to listen to and follow instructions, and gain confidence in the water.

> Other learning outcomes are to increase the motor development,

socialisation, water safety and stroke development opportunities for the participants attending our programs. All these skills not only assist in providing transferrable learning opportunities but also lead confidence in

learning to swim, a crucial life skill.

RE: COVID - 19 UPDATE

Dear Parents/Carers

NSW Public Schools continue to be safe learning environments which operate in line with the advice of the Australian Health Protection Principal Committee and NSW Health. All students should be learning on campus and in their classroom with peers, unless they have a medical certificate to support their absence.

Parents and Carers are reminded that students should not attend school if they have flu-like symptoms. Due to the low rates of

influenza currently circulating in our community, we must take symptoms seriously.

Students or staff who display flu-like symptoms should not be at school. They are now required to show a negative COVID-19 test result and be free of flu-like symptoms before returning to school.

In addition to the personal hygiene protocols, physical distancing of adults and the enhanced cleaning already operating in all schools, as of Wednesday 19 August all schools will also be required to

limit, where possible, the mixing of groups of students, place inter-school activities on hold and restrict chanting, singing and the use of wind instruments in schools.

This means that while students will continue to work with their classmates in the usual learning programs, schools will limit interactions of students from different years, where appropriate.

A reminder that 'non-essential' adults are still not permitted on school grounds or at school events. This includes parents and carers. Kindly contact us by phone/ email if you so require.



How To Protect Yourself from Infection



COVID test results for HSC students will be prioritised by NSW Health to minimise any impact on HSC preparations. When HSC students are getting tested, they need to advise the GP/clinic that they are currently doing their HSC so their test results can be prioritised.

Sun and UV at School



Learning about skin cancer prevention

In the lead up to summer, students will learn about sun protection, and how to make healthy, safe and proactive choices that reduce their risk of skin cancer.

Statistics show that melanoma is the most common cancer affecting young Australians aged 15-24. With that in mind, we will be teaching students about the dangers of sun exposure and that skin cancer prevention starts with practising sun-safe behaviours at school.


This focus on sun safety follows the release of a suite of interactive skin cancer prevention resources for NSW schools. The *Sun and UV at School* classroom resources are curriculum aligned and have been developed by the Cancer Institute NSW in consultation with the NSW Department of Education, other edu-

cation advisors and Cancer Council's SunSmart program.

As part of the initiative, students will be encouraged to take part in a *Sun and UV School Challenge*, designing contemporary shade solutions that protect them, their friends and local community from the harmful effects of the sun.


