Her laser-like lens on student wellbeing and learning enhances the engagement and sense of belonging for all the students in our school. She is a dynamic member of our school's Learning and Support, Wellbeing and Attendance teams. Her mentoring of Indigenous students has lifted rates of attendance for students at risk, reduced incidents of negative behaviour and supported the successful transition of Indigenous students to careers and study beyond school. Her office is the "Central Station" of our school and the numerous positive interactions with staff and students that take place in it each day embody the strong culture of positive collaboration that Alison nurtures in our school.



Alison leads and changes lives by example. And by lives, I mean students and staff alike. She is a dedicated educator and hence our community has grown in their knowledge of our local Gamilaraay culture and language, because of Alison. She frequently shares her knowledge in the classroom during either Stage 4 LOTE or Stage 5 Aboriginal Studies. She has led staff professional learning for all public-school staff in our town, and the feedback from such days has always been exceptionally positive as has the observable flow-on effect to staff morale and interactions with our students.

Alison's integrity, resilience and collegiality are hallmarks of her daily practice. She represents the very best of Public Education and our community is indeed fortunate that she works and learns alongside us.



Change to isolation requirements in schools

On 30 September, the National Cabinet announced that from Friday 14 October 2022 people who test positive to COVID-19 do not need to self-isolate.

However, students and staff should continue to stay home when sick. Students, staff and visitors should only attend school when symptom free. We strongly encourage all students, staff and visitors to follow the guidance issued by NSW Health. In line with this advice, we will continue to send home students displaying symptoms.

Anyone who believes they have been exposed to COVID-19 is strongly recommended to monitor for symptoms and test if they have any concerns, as well as wear a mask. The department will continue to make rapid antigen tests (RATs) available for students and staff who need to test for COVID-19. Please contact the school office if you require any tests.

(Years 9 -11 - Casio fxAU 82 plus) (Years 7-8 - Abacus)

Year 7 teachers will allow all students to take their Abacus calculators home. These were provided to all Year 7 students via Equity Funding at the beginning of Term 1. CHS will no longer be keeping these at school. Students are responsible for these calculators from this time. This will enable all students to utilise their equipment for home study preparation prior to yearly examinations.



Wether Challenge

Year 11 Primary Industry students recently presented wethers at the Merino Wether Challenge in Dubbo.

The competition, run by Sydney University, provides six Egelabra wethers to schools where data is collected and used to map the effect of environment on phenotype. Each school decides how the sheep will be fed and cared for. In Dubbo, each of the wethers is visually assessed, shorn, the fleece and the animal weighed, the fleece classed and the carcass of each wether is assessed. Students participated in a careers discussion panel, sheep scanning and wool judging and had the opportunity to see rams for sale and talk to producers.

By participating in this event, students gain:

- practical, hands-on skills in sheep management
- a better understanding of sheep and wool production as a business
 - contact with many aspects of the Merino sheep industry
 - a chance to network with industry participants and other students
 - an enjoyable experience with Merino sheep and the industry
 - a positive perspective on a career with sheep and wool.




From the Careers Desk




